	in Christ. "So those who accepted his message were baptized," (Acts 2:41) Some churches practice a "baptism of confirmation" for babies and children. This ceremony is intended to be a covenant between the parents and God on behalf of the child. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to believe in Christ on his own. The purpose is for the parents to publicly confess their commitment to Christ. This custom began about 300 years after the Bible was completed. This is different from the baptism talked about in the Bible which is only for those old

enough to believe. In order to adhere closely to biblical teaching and to avoid unnecessary confusion, BayLife Community Church does not practice baby baptism.

The Meaning of the Lord's Supper

Jesus never asked His disciples to remember His birth. But He did instruct them to remember His death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called "ordinances") as reminders of His death. These two ordinances are: Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The Lord's Supper is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

Jesus never said when or how often believers should observe The Lord's Supper. He instituted it on a Thursday night. Since it is a 'supper', it may seem more appropriate to observe it at an evening service when possible.

- 5. **Servant-Leadership** that demonstrates humility, teamwork, and unity in Christ
- 6. **Simplicity** that inspires effective ministries, creative ideas, and personal participation

EFCA Statement of Faith

The Evangelical Free Church of America is an association of autonomous churches united around these theological convictions:

God

1. We believe in one God, Creator of all things, holy, infinitely perfect, and eternally existing in a loving unity of three equally divine Persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Having limitless knowledge and sovereign power, God has graciously purposed from eternity to redeem a people for Himself and to make all things new for His own glory.

The Bible

2. We believe that God has spoken in the Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, through the words of human authors. As the verbally inspired Word of God, the Bible is without error in the original writings, the complete revelation of His will for salvation, and the ultimate authority by which every realm of human knowledge and endeavor should be judged. Therefore, it is to be believed in all that it teaches, obeyed in all that it requires, and trusted in all that it promises.

The Human Condition

3. We believe that God created Adam and Eve in His image, but they sinned when tempted by Satan. In union with Adam, human beings are sinners by nature and by choice, alienated from God, and under His wrath. Only through God's saving work in Jesus Christ can we be rescued, reconciled and renewed.

Jesus Christ

4. We believe that Jesus Christ is God incarnate, fully God and fully man, one Person in two natures. Jesus—Israel's promised Messiah—was conceived through the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He lived a sinless life, was crucified under Pontius Pilate, arose bodily from the dead, ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father as our High Priest and Advocate.

The Work of Christ

5. We believe that Jesus Christ, as our representative and substitute, shed His blood on the cross as the perfect, all-sufficient sacrifice for our sins. His atoning death and victorious resurrection constitute the only ground for salvation.

The Holy Spirit

6. We believe that the Holy Spirit, in all that He does, glorifies the Lord Jesus Christ. He convicts the world of its guilt. He regenerates sinners, and in Him they are baptized into union with Christ and adopted as heirs in the family of God. He also indwells, illuminates, guides, equips and empowers believers for Christ-like living and service.

The Church

7. We believe that the true church comprises all who have been justified by God's grace through faith alone in Christ alone. They are united by the Holy Spirit in the body of Christ, of which He is the Head. The true church is manifest in local churches, whose membership should be composed only of believers. The Lord Jesus mandated two ordinances, baptism and the Lord's Supper, which visibly and tangibly express the gospel. Though they are not the means of salvation, when celebrated by the church in genuine faith, these ordinances confirm and nourish the believer.

Christian Living

8. We believe that God's justifying grace must not be separated from His sanctifying power and purpose. God commands us to love Him supremely and others sacrificially, and to live out our faith with care for one another, compassion toward the poor and justice for the oppressed. With God's Word, the Spirit's power, and fervent prayer in Christ's name, we are to combat the spiritual forces of evil. In obedience to Christ's commission, we are to make disciples among all people, always bearing witness to the gospel in word and deed.

Christ's Return*

9. We believe in the personal, bodily and glorious return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The coming of Christ, at a time known only to God, demands constant expectancy and, as our blessed hope, motivates the believer to godly living, sacrificial service and energetic mission.

Response and Eternal Destiny

10. We believe that God commands everyone everywhere to believe the gospel by turning to Him in repentance and receiving the Lord Jesus Christ. We believe that God will raise the dead bodily and judge the world, assigning the unbeliever to condemnation and eternal conscious punishment and the believer to eternal blessedness and joy with the Lord in the new heaven and the new earth, to the praise of His glorious grace. Amen.

Our Lifestyle Statement

What We Practice

Beliefs are not worth much unless they are translated into actions. Based on what the Bible teaches, we feel very strongly about the following seven practices:

1. Bible as Our Sole Authority

- "All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness," (2Tim. 3:16)
- Since God's Word is the only completely reliable and truthful authority, we accept the Bible as our manual for living. Our first question when faced with a decision is "What does the Bible say?" We practice daily Bible reading, Bible study, and Bible memorization. The Bible is the basis for all we believe.

2. Autonomy of Each Local Church

- "He [Christ] is also the head of the body, the church; ..." (Col. 1:18)
- Christ is the recognized head of our church, not any person, group, or religious organization.
- While recognizing the value of associating and cooperating with other groups of Christians, we believe every local church should be self-governing and independent from any denominational control.

3. Priesthood of Every Believer

- "and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father ..." (Rev. 1:6)
- "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, ..., a people for his possession, ..." (1Pet. 2:9)
- The Bible teaches that every Christian is called to "full time" Christian service, regardless of his or her vocation. We practice the truth that every believer is a minister by encouraging every member to find a place of service and ministry. Every believer has direct access to God through prayer and Bible reading.

4. Giving

- "Each person should do as he has decided in his heart—not reluctantly or out of compulsion, since God loves a cheerful giver." (2Cor. 9:7)
- "But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? For everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your own hand." (1Chron. 29:14)
- "I know, my God, that you test the heart and that you are pleased with what is right. I have willingly given all these things with an upright heart, and now I have seen your people who are present here giving joyfully and willingly to you." (1Chron. 29:17)

• In the Old Testament times, tithing was to be practiced along with free-will offerings (Gen. 14:18-20; 28:22; Lev. 26:30; Mal. 3:8). Tithing was giving 10% of one's income to the Lord. The free-will offering was a gift to the Lord above the tithe. While the concepts of tithing and free-will offerings are not taught in the New Testament, they are standards by which giving could be evaluated. (see Matt. 23:23; Lk. 11:42)

5. Spirit-led Living & Ministry

- [Jesus said], "I am the vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in me and I in him produces much fruit, because you can do nothing without me." (Jn. 15:5)
- We believe the only way possible to live the Christian life is by God's power within us. So we seek to practice a daily dependence on God's Spirit to enable us to do what is right. (Phil. 2:13, Eph. 5:18)
- "Do not lack diligence in zeal; be fervent in the Spirit; serve the Lord." (Rom. 12:11)
- "For you were called to be free, brothers and sisters; only don't use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but serve one another through love." (Gal. 5:13)

6. Telling Others About Christ

- "but in your hearts regard Christ the Lord as holy, ready at any time to give a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you." (1Pe. 3:15)
- It is the responsibility of every Christian to share the Good News with those with whom God brings us into contact. We practice personal sharing about Christ and inviting friends to church.

BayLife Community Church Constitution

I. NAME

The name of this organization, a nonprofit corporation, shall be "BayLife Community Church."

II. STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Statement of Faith of this Church shall be the same as that of The Evangelical Free Church of America (EFCA).

III. STANDING

This church shall maintain membership with The Evangelical Free Church of America and its branches.

IV. PURPOSE

The purpose of this church is to fulfill the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) and Great Commandment (Matthew 22:37-40) of Jesus Christ. We shall reach lives, share lives, touch lives, and build lives for the glory of God. In order to glorify God, we "reach lives" by making disciples of all people through the gospel of Jesus Christ and helping them to receive Christ as their Lord and Savior. We "share lives" by developing Christian fellowship among church members. We "touch lives" by loving, serving, and financially or materially assisting one another as the Bible teaches us. We "build lives" by equipping believers of Christ for godly living and ministry in obedience to Christ and the Scripture through holistic discipleship. Ultimately, we glorify God through Christ-like living and corporate worship as the body of Christ.

V. MEMBERSHIP

The church shall receive as members those who have received Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior as taught in the Bible. As such, they are born again Christians who manifest the fruits of the Spirit in their lives, and are in agreement with the doctrine and polity of this church as stated in the bylaws of this church.

VI. PROPERTY RIGHTS

If the church membership votes to dissolve, and cease to function as a church of like faith and practice, or if the membership should dissolve through some disaster, the property rights shall be assigned to EFCA and its branches to enable said district to renew the work or use the assets thereof for further Gospel enterprises.

VII. GOVERNMENT

Ultimate authority lies in Jesus Christ as the head of the Church and in the Scripture as the basis for all faith and practice. This church shall remain free and self-governing. The government is vested in its membership and administered by its officers. In function, final authority shall reside in the membership. They shall approve and/or affirm Biblically qualified leadership to carry out Christ's purposes.

VIII. OFFICERS

The officers of this church shall be the Church Board, and other officers as deemed necessary by the church as described in the bylaws.

IX. PROVISION FOR BYLAWS

A supplement to this constitution known as the bylaws shall embody the stated qualifications for church leaders and officers. The bylaws shall also include officers' duties, provisions for appointment of additional leaders and teachers, conditions for membership, method by which members are received, along with other rules and regulations for church activities as needed.

X. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this constitution may be made at any business meeting when said proposed Amendments have been presented to the membership in writing via U.S. Mail to the member's address on file and posted it on our church website for at least four weeks prior to the business meeting. A two-thirds majority of those present at the business meeting is required for passage.

BayLife Community Church Bylaws

Article 1 Membership

- 1.1 Membership shall be granted by the Church Board to applicants who provide a credible testimony of conversion to Jesus Christ to the Church Board or to a committee of the Church Board established for this purpose and who affirm the purpose and bylaws of the church.
- 1.2 Applicants for membership shall have been baptized prior to the granting of membership.
- 1.3 Applicants for membership shall have completed such other procedures as are established by the Church Board prior to the granting of membership.
- 1.4 Members who are age 18 or older shall have full voting privileges on all matters presented to the church body in business meetings.
- 1.5 Membership may be terminated by the Church Board for the following reasons:
 - 1.5.1 Death of the member.
 - 1.5.2 Written request of the member.
 - 1.5.3 Lack of any attendance of the church for a period of six months or more.
 - 1.5.4 Failure to respond satisfactorily to discipline by the Church Board.

Article 2 Discipline

- 2.1 When one member observes or experiences behavior on the part of a second member which is inconsistent with biblical expectations and is potentially injurious the first member, to the second member and/or to the church body, the first member shall share his/her concerns privately with the second member in keeping with Matthew 18:15-17 and Galatians 6:1-5. If the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, the first member shall share his/her concerns with the second member in the presence of one or two other members of the church. If the matter is still not satisfactorily resolved, it shall be presented to the Church Board for resolution.
- 2.2 If, upon investigation, the Church Board determines that the matter has substance, it shall present the particular issues of concern to the second member, the biblical standards that appear to have been violated, the remedies required, and the actions that will be taken failing this, including removal from membership (1 Corinthians 5).
- 2.3 If the second member demonstrates biblical sorrow over the behavior and takes the recommended action to remedy the consequences of the behavior in the best manner possible, and demonstrates a re-direction of life so as to cease this behavior in the future, the Church Board shall conclude that restoration has been completed.
- 2.4 If the second member fails to respond to the discipline required by the Church Board, the Board shall take whatever action it deems necessary, consistent with biblical standards, including removal from membership.

- 2.5 The disciplined person may appeal the Church Board's action to the church membership within 30 days. The church membership in a business meeting closed to non-members and members not eligible to vote, by majority vote of those members present and eligible to vote, shall then either ratify the action of the Church Board or rescind it. If the latter, the Church Board shall then determine an alternative course of action.
- 2.6 The accused member has the right to present a defense to the church board or elders which includes presenting witnesses or documents in their defense. An accused member must present their defense within 30 days after receiving notice of potential discipline.

Article 3 Church Board

- 3.1 All authority not specifically reserved to the membership as a whole (the congregation) in these bylaws shall be granted to the Church Board. The following require approval by the membership:
 - 3.1.1 Ratification and removal of members of the Church Board.
 - 3.1.2 Approval of the annual budget or budget amendment.
 - 3.1.3 Voting on the call or dismissal of the Senior Pastor.
 - 3.1.4 The purchase, sale or encumber of real property.
 - 3.1.5 Amendments to the constitution or bylaws.
 - 3.1.6 The dissolution of the church and/or corporation.
- 3.2 It is the responsibility of the Church Board to take such actions and establish such environments as necessary to further the purpose of this church in a manner consistent with biblical directives and principles.
- 3.3 The function of the Church Board is to establish policy and assume the responsibility of governance of the affairs of the congregation. The Board shall maintain a distinction between governance and management, and shall delegate to the Senior Pastor and other staff and lay leaders the operation and implementation of the affairs of the church.
- 3.4 The Church Board shall be responsible for the exercise of spiritual discipline in accordance with the bylaws.
- 3.5 The Church Board shall have the authority to commission prospective Christian leaders and to charter new congregations.
- 3.6 The Church Board shall consist of the Senior Pastor and such those who meet the requirements of church board members established in 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9. The Board shall determine its size consistent with the responsibilities to be carried out. Each Board member, with the exception of the Senior Pastor shall be a member in good standing of the church for at least one year before being selected as a Board member.
- 3.7 The Church Board shall select its own membership, subject to the following:
 - 3.7.1 No selected Board member shall begin his service until ratified for this position by a majority vote of the church membership in business meeting.
 - 3.7.2 Each Board member shall serve a full term of three years, and may be selected for a successive three-year term. Following two full terms of service (six successive years), there must be at least a one-year period before being selected again as a Board

member, even to fill a partial term. An initial partial term shall not be counted against the two-term limit. Senior Pastor is not subject to the two-term limit.

- 3.8 The Church Board shall select its own chairman annually at the first Board meeting following the church's first business meeting of the year.
- 3.9 The Church Board may remove a current Board member by a two-third vote of all Board members at will, including lack of attendance and failure to fulfill one's responsibilities.
- 3.10 The Church Board may remove the Senior Pastor at will by a majority vote of all Board members. The Senior Pastor shall cease to function in that office as of the moment of that vote. However, his removal shall not become effective until ratified by a majority vote at a duly called business meeting, with written notice of this business item provided 14 days prior to the date of the business meeting to each member eligible to vote. If the vote fails to ratify the Church Board's action, the Senior Pastor is immediately restored to his office. If the vote ratifies the action of the Church Board, the Senior Pastor is dismissed as of that moment. Terms of severance shall be determined by the Church Board.
- 3.11 At such time as the position of Senior Pastor is vacant, the Church Board shall, at a time it deems appropriate, establish a pastoral search team whose purpose is to identify and present a properly qualified candidate for this position to the Church Board for approval and subsequent ratification by the congregation.
- 3.12 For legal purposes, the Church Board is the Board of Directors of the corporation. The Chairman of the Church Board shall be the President of the corporation. The Secretary of the Church Board shall be the secretary of the corporation.

Article 4 Pastors

- 4.1 The Senior Pastor, by virtue of his office, shall be a member of the Church Board, with vote. He shall be ultimately accountable for the leadership and management of all of the affairs of the church. He shall lead in a manner consistent with the mission, vision, values, strategic plan, objectives and policies established by the Church Board, with a view to seeing them realized in the most fulfilling manner possible. He shall be the spiritual leader of the congregation.
- 4.2 The Senior Pastor shall engage and supervise, directly or through others, such staff as are needed to fulfill the church's purpose. The power to engage includes the power to dismiss. Those additional staff members who are deemed to be pastors or ministers shall only be engaged or dismissed following the approval of the Church Board. The Senior Pastor and all paid staff shall be at-will employees.
- 4.3 The Senior Pastor shall establish such other positions, councils, committees, commissions, task forces or other entities which he deems necessary to carry out the affairs of the church in a manner consistent with the mission, vision, values, strategic plan, objectives and policies established by the Church Board. Each such entity shall have a mission statement, a position description, a line of authority and a defined term (time limit) for its existence. An entity may be renewed for additional terms as appropriate. The above entities shall be

- ratified by the Church Board prior to implementation. The Senior Pastor shall appoint qualified persons to these entities.
- 4.4 The Senior Pastor shall prepare an annual budget for all facets of the church's ministry. The Church Board, upon approval of the budget, shall present it to the membership for ratification at the annual business meeting. It may be amended at any special business meeting. At no time shall total expenditures exceed the total authorized budget.
- 4.5 The Senior Pastor is responsible to the Church Board for the execution of his leadership and management responsibilities.

Article 5 Business Meetings

- 5.1 The annual business meeting of the congregation shall be held at a date and time specified by the Church Board, and shall take place at approximately the same time and date each year.
- 5.2 Special meetings of the congregation shall be held when called by the Church Board or upon written request by 25 percent of the members eligible to vote. Written notice of the meeting shall be given 14 days prior to the meeting to all members eligible to vote. Notice shall include a description of the items to be considered. Only those items so noticed shall be acted upon.
- 5.3 A person so designated by the Church Board shall moderate the meeting.
- 5.4 A quorum shall consist of 20 percent of the members of the church eligible to vote.
- 5.5 Majority vote of those present and voting unless otherwise provided in these bylaws shall decide all matters. Absentee ballots and proxy voting will not be allowed.
- 5.6 Business meetings are to be conducted with dignity and order.
- 5.7 The church's fiscal year is from January 1st through December 31st.

Article 6 Political Practices

6.1 No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Article 7 Term, Limitations, Dissolution

- 7.1 The term of existence of this corporation shall be in perpetuity without specific term of existence.
- 7.2 The corporation is organized and operated exclusively for religious or charitable purposes within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

7.3 The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to religious or charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person.

Article 8 Affiliation

8.1 This church is in affiliation with the Evangelical Free Church of America. In addition to this affiliation, it may engage in voluntary associations with other groups where such association will serve to further the church's purpose.

Article 9 Amendments

9.1 Amendments to this bylaws may be made at any business meeting when said proposed amendments have been presented to the membership in writing via U.S. Mail to the member's address on file and posted it on our church website for at least four weeks prior to the business meeting. A two-thirds majority of those present at the business meeting is required for passage.

The Story of BayLife Community Church

BayLife Community Church was a church plant started in Foster City, California, by Pastor Frederick Chang, his family, and 2 other families on January 20, 2001.

Originally, due to our very limited resources and manpower, BayLife focused on reaching Asian Americans for Christ. We started out reaching contemporary Asian immigrants and the 2nd generation Asian Americans who are not used to the traditional style of church programs. However, God used us to reach people of different ethnic groups and languages though still with a majority of Asian Americans.

Foster City was chosen as our ministry field because of ...

- Its strategic location in the Bay Area,
- · Its highly unchurched population,
- Its high density of Asian Americans every 1 in 5, and
- Its shortage of Christian churches in the area less than 10.

Eventually, God expanded our ministry to up and down the peninsula.

Undoubtedly, this mid-Peninsula area is difficult for pioneer church planting and church ministry. Unquestionably, this is also where God wants us, Christians, to witness Christ and preach His gospel. "... For we do not want to boast about work already done in another man's territory." (2Cor. 10:16 NIV)

The Lord has been gracious in leading and providing for BayLife's ministry for the past years.

- He has provided meeting places for us, from Foster City Recreation Center, to Edgewater Townhome's Clubhouse, Crystal Springs Bible Church, Parkside Elementary School, Challenge School (Chinese School), and, now, Belmont Community Center.
- He has used BayLife to reach hundreds of adults, children, and elderly with the grace and truth of Jesus Christ.
- Children have grown up into young adults knowing and walking with Christ.
- Many life changing experiences are evident among our members through these years.

Surely, this is not the work of man but of God among us and through us. May He and Him alone be glorified. Amen!





Who Are We Affiliated With?

We are affiliated with the **Evangelical Free Church of America.** Even so, there is no denominational control or hierarchy, as there is in other denominations. We are self-governed and **free** to determine our own affairs. For example:

- We choose our own pastor
- We own our own building(s) and assets
- We determine our own programs

The EFCA

The Evangelical Free Church of America (EFCA) is an association of about 1,250 autonomous churches united by a mutual commitment to serve the Lord Jesus Christ with the guidance of the Holy Spirit and in obedience to the Word of God. We are committed to cooperate with one another in ministry and fellowship as we seek to fulfill the Great Commission which Christ entrusted to His Church.

The term **Evangelical** refers to our commitment to the proclamation of the Gospel, and to the authority of the Scriptures as the only safe and sufficient guide to faith and practice. The term **Free** refers to the autonomy of local churches, as well as to a congregational form of government. Evangelical Free Churches depend upon the active participation of lay people in their decisions and ministries.

The Mission

The EFCA is a mission movement committed: **to glorify God by multiplying healthy churches among all people.** (Matt. 28:19-20) The logo captures her essential heartbeat and commitments:

- The cross of Christ stands at the center of the gospel we believe and preach.
- Our movement is vibrant, healthy and growing, composed of individuals and churches of all shapes, sizes and hues.
- We are poised on the world, springing forth in spiritual multiplication around the world.
- Our movement must be inclusive of "all people," regardless of ethnic group, geography or national origin.

The History

The Evangelical Free Church of America began in the Scandinavian countries of Sweden, Norway, and Denmark. Its religious and philosophical roots are firmly planted on the foundational principles of two major historical events. The first was the 16th century Protestant Reformation, which changed the religious climate all across Europe. The Church had strayed far from a biblically-based foundation, and reform back to biblical roots was desperately needed. Three revolutionary principles of the Reformation laid the foundation for spiritual renewal and formed the basis for the "free church" movement during the next 250 years:

- Sola Scriptura ("only the Scriptures")
- Sola Gratia ("only by grace")
- Sola Fides ("only by faith")

The second major historical event was a mid-19th century grass-roots movement across Europe to break away from established state-controlled churches which were, in many cases, simply the arms of the government. In the Scandinavian countries, the Lutheran Church acted in such a manner.

The Distinctives

- 1. The Evangelical Free Church of America is inclusive, not exclusive.
- 2. The Evangelical Free Church of America is ecumenical in spirit though not in structure.
- 3. The Evangelical Free Church of America is evangelical but not separatistic.
- 4. The Evangelical Free Church of America believes in liberty with responsibility.
- 5. The Evangelical Free Church of America believes in both the rational and relational dimensions of Christianity.
- 6. The Evangelical Free Church of America is congregational in government.

What It Means to be a Member?

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At BayLife Community Church we recognize the need for a formal membership. We ask you to commit to membership for four reasons:

I. A Biblical Reason: Christ is committed to the Church

"... Christ loved the church and gave himself for her ..." (Eph. 5:25)

II. A Cultural Reason: It is an Antidote to Our Society

We live in an age where very few want to be committed to anything...a job...a marriage...our country. This attitude has even produced a generation of "church shoppers and hoppers". Membership swims against the current of America's "consumer religion." It is an unselfish decision. Commitment always builds character.

III. A Practical Reason: It Defines Who Can Be Counted On

Every team must have a roster. Every school must have an enrollment. Every business has a payroll. Every army has an enlistment. Even our country takes a census and requires voter registration. Membership identifies our family.

IV. A Personal Reason: It Produces Spiritual Growth

The New Testament places a major emphasis on the need for Christians to be accountable to each other for spiritual growth. You cannot be accountable when you're not committed to any specific church family.

What is expected of me as a member?

At BayLife Community Church we never ask our members to do more than the Bible clearly teaches. We only expect our members to do what the Bible expects every Christian to do. These responsibilities are spelled out in the Membership Covenant.

The BayLife Community Church Membership Covenant
